Day 2 - explore the city

Launceston by Foot

Get your bearings and learn about the history of Launceston with a walking tour in the heart of the city.

Queen Victoria Museum (QVMAG)

Entry is free. Spread across two sites, QVMAG is home to art, history and natural science. Visit the Museum at Inveresk and head across to the Art Gallery at Royal Park after lunch.

Tasmanian Design Centre

Design Tasmania is a not-for-profit design centre dedicated since 1976 to furthering design in Tasmania through their exhibitions, collection and store.

Day 3 - heritage, landscapes and historic villages

Woolmers Estate

The UNESCO World Heritage site of Woolmers Estate is situated in Longford, Tasmania, an easy 25 minute drive from Launceston. The Nigel Peck Centre located at Woolmers includes two gallery spaces, a restaurant, cafe and gift shop.
